About this Grant

Neighbors Helping Neighbors plans to increase access to intensive case management services, nutritious food, preventive healthcare, transportation, and substance use disorder/behavioral health services to unhoused and low-income population in McKinney 75069. Together, the Wellness Center for Older Adults, Hope Restored Missions, Lifepath Systems, and Awareness, Inc. are creating innovative ways to address the health disparities associated with the unhoused and low-income neighbors in Collin County. The program will assist clients to move toward self-sufficiency by addressing basic health, social, and safety needs while also providing opportunity for long-term housing solutions.

Program Milestones

To achieve by December 2024

Integrate unhoused individuals back into the community by providing essential behavioral health, preventive healthcare, and supportive services.



- Increase access to quality care by creating innovative patient-centered solutions.
- Increase the ability of behavioral health professionals to provide high-quality care to clients.
- Create an innovative solution to address social determinants of health (i.e., lack of access to food, transportation, and culturally competent services).

Transforming Lives Through Collaboration

"The Neighbors Helping Neighbors collaborative is excited about being able to strategically reach our unhoused neighbors in 75069. As the average rental rate increases, the number of unhoused individuals continues to rise making the demand much greater. This formula becomes more difficult to solve. Having the ability to dedicate efforts to a specific ZIP code affords us the ability to launch a pilot program that can then be expanded across the county. The team was very deliberate in naming this collaboration. We see the need for these services across all of Collin County. Neighbors Helping Neighbors has the potential of growing to meet those needs on such a larger scale."

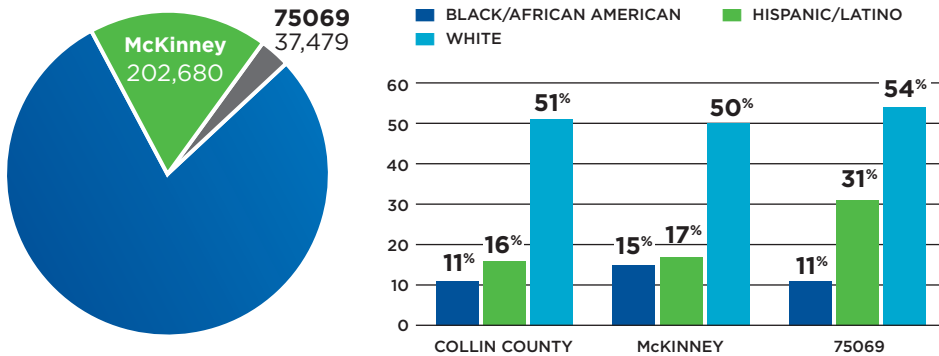

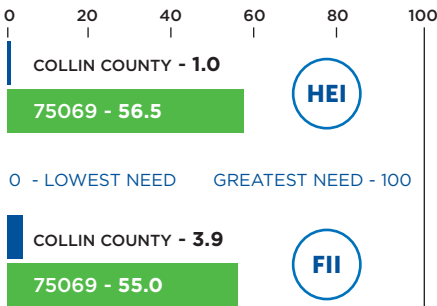

SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

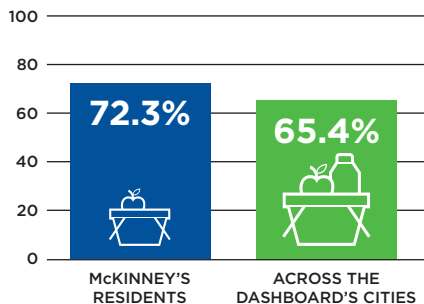

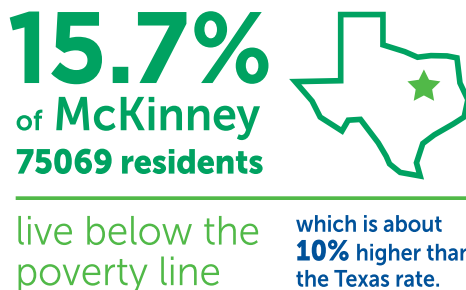
Health Equity Index (HEI)

incorporates estimates for six different social and economic determinants of health that are associated with poor health outcomes. The data, which covers income, poverty, unemployment, occupation, educational attainment, and linguistic barriers, are then standardized and averaged to create one composite index value for every ZIP code in the United States.

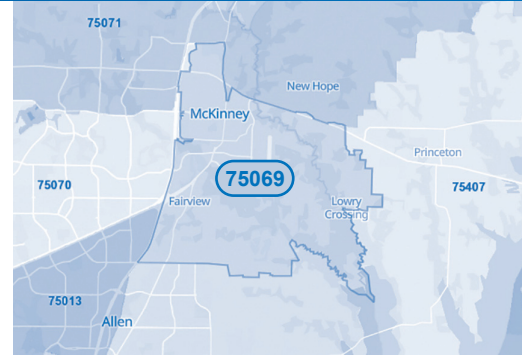
The Food Insecurity Index (FII)

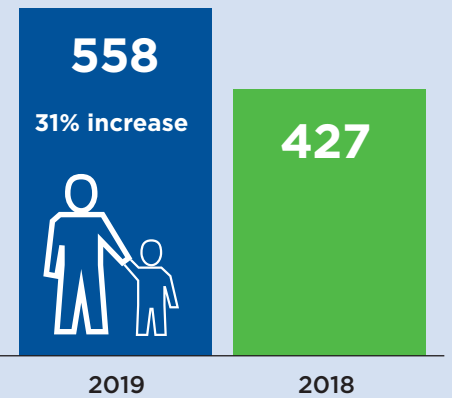
