Through **Project HHH**, Center of Hope implements existing strategies like Basic Services (food and financial assistance) and long-term assistance (job training and navigation), while integrating mental health services. In collaboration with other local nonprofits, churches, businesses, and civic organizations, Center of Hope is creating a network of volunteers and providers to assist residents, adults age 18+, to become stronger in mind, body, and spirit.

Meet Molly*



Molly came into our new Center of Hope location in Springtown depressed and broken. Just a few months ago, she had been working in the construction industry and things seemed to be going her way. Her son had recently come out of prison and she was feeling like her family was coming together.

In April 2021, she and her husband, both in the early 50s, came down with COVID-19. Unfortunately, COVID-19 was hanging on longer than anticipated and her position had to be filled with someone else. She and her husband stayed isolated in their home for some time. One morning, Molly woke up to find that her husband had succumbed to the virus.

Molly was devastated. Her life as she knew it had completely changed. Because of the Texas Health Community Impact Project, Center of Hope was able to provide food for her family, connect her with a life coach, refer her to professional counseling, and begin to work with her on finding another construction job through our Careers Now program.

It will be a long road for Molly, but Center of Hope will walk alongside her until she is back on her feet.

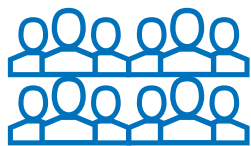

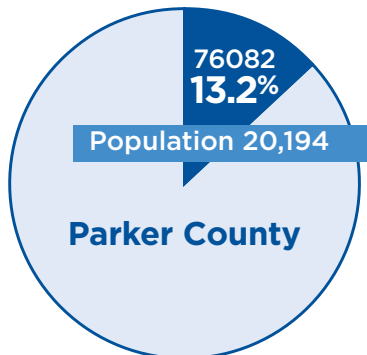

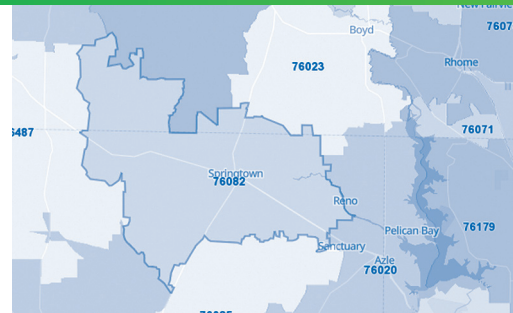

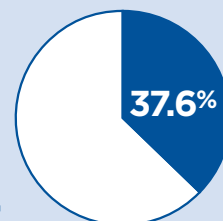
