What We Do

- Provide medical care and a safe place to heal for adults experiencing homelessness who have been released from a hospital.
- Services are at Austin Street Center's emergency center in Dallas. You will work with a care team focused on your medical and social needs.
- Onsite health services will be provided for 4 to 6 weeks. This can include medication management, wound care, blood pressure screening and/or physical therapy.
- A dedicated team will help you connect to a doctor and/or mental health service, assist with support services (food, transportation, income), and especially housing.

Criteria

You are eligible for the program if you are:

- Male, over the age of 18 and homeless or at-risk homeless,
- Willing to take part in your care,
- Can follow facility rules.

Austin Street

Founded in 1983, Austin Street Center is an emergency shelter with 400+ beds that serves men, ages 45 and older, and women, ages 18 and older. Each person who finds shelter with Austin Street is provided a safe place to sleep, showers, clothing, and meals. Once their basic needs are met, they can begin working on other aspects of their lives that will help them transition out of homelessness. Austin Street offers several programs including a work readiness program; veteran program; women's program; substance abuse support; and spiritual support.
